

Vaughan wins \$200m rail project

Logistics specialists Vaughan Constructions has been appointed to develop \$200 million worth of rail infrastructure and warehousing in the NSW Riverina for transport specialist Colin Rees and Griffith rice growers, the Morshead family's Amberley Group.

Melbourne-based Vaughan will design and build 45,000 square metres of warehousing at the Ettamogah Rail

Hub near Albury, owned by the Colin Rees Group, and develop and construct a new rail hub, sidings and more than 100,000 sq m of warehouse space, hardstand and road networks on 68 hectares in Widgelli, south east of Griffith owned by the Morsheads.

The new rail facilities will let Riverina farmers move produce more quickly and efficiently to the main eastern seaboard ports, or even as far as Perth, using CRG's Regional Connect rail shuttle.
