NORTHERN CONSTELLATION FOR LINFOX

Australian logistics giant Linfox, is set to improve freight management in the nation's top end, engaging Vaughan for the design and construction of their North Star project.

This new intermodal facility east of Darwin, follows on from the successful completion of two major facilities by Vaughan for Linfox in Western Australia.

North Star sits on a 21,500m² development site in East Arm, just 16kms east of Darwin's CBD. Within close proximity to the Port and with direct access to the Darwin Rail Freight Terminal, the project once completed will reduce cargo handling, for faster distribution across the country.

Detailed value engineering exercises and carefully planned energy efficient design initiatives by Vaughan has provided Linfox with a seven per cent construction cost saving, a considerable amount given Linfox's long term property ownership strategy.

As the ABS reports a decline in construction activity across the state for the six quarters to June 2016, the North Star project is good news for local trades and contractors who will benefit directly from the new build.

The North Star project reinforces Vaughan's position as a leader in the Design and Construct market in Australia's north. Having previously completed two other projects for Northline and Cahill Transport within the East Arm precinct, Vaughan Constructions is delighted to be directly involved in the region's growth.

"Vaughan has remained the essential ingredient in all seven projects because of their track record in handing over projects on time and the superiority of their build."

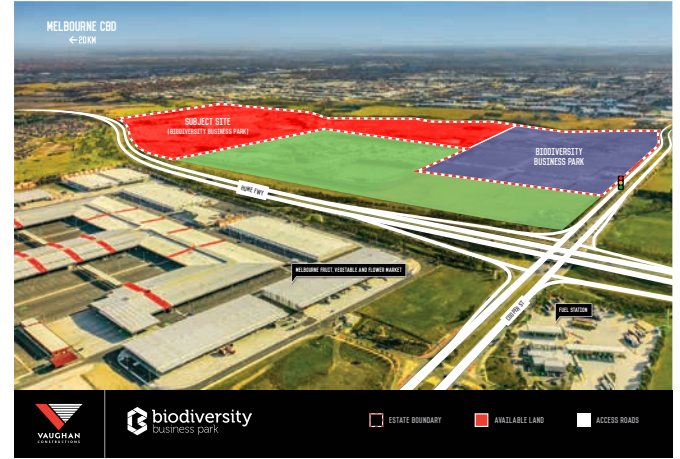


UNLOCKING DAVCOR'S FUTURE

INDUSTRIAL EXCELLENCE AT MBA AWARDS

The Master Builders Association has recognised Vaughan Constructions industrial sector leadership, with projects in both Victoria and New South Wales taking out the commercial building industry's most prestigious event.

The Woolworths Meat Company Facility, Truganina and Diageo Highbay Automated Warehouse, Huntingwood were announced as the Winners for Excellence in Construction of Industrial Buildings in both states.



Woolworths temperature controlled meat production and distribution facility was the first of its kind for the retailer in Australia.

The purpose of the building was to automate the preparation of retail ready meat for the grocery giant, therefore minimising "in-store" preparation and packaging.

In another national first Vaughan Constructions partnered with Diageo to complete their 32 metre high, 5,000m² fully automated high-bay facility.

The facility's six-aisle, double-deep, storage system more than doubles the previous facility's capacity.

Operating as a black warehouse the Huntingwood plant has 24/7 robotic collection, with specialised automation systems ensuring no manhandling is required.

The awards solidified Vaughan Constructions reputation as Australia's superior food, beverage and automation experts.
